LOOK, LET ME INTRODUCE YOU TO THE OTHERS YOU WILL BE WORKING WITH.

Maybe some of them could tell me what my job duties are.

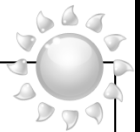

ACOLYTES TRADITIONAL SERVICES



Pastor Schafer is interested in speaking with any parents who have an interest in their child being an acolyte at the 8:30 or 9:45 a.m. Traditional Services. Typically, acolytes may vary in age from 9 to 15.

Training would be provided by Pastor Schafer. Acolytes would serve on a rotation basis. The rule of the acolyte is to enter the sanctuary during the prelude carrying the light of Christ and light the altar candles. Near the end of the service, the acolyte extinguishes the altar candles and carries the flame out.



Training and other aspects of traditional worship will be provided according to interest and age as desired.

Why does a particular sin I observe in another illicit such a strong emotional response in me? Is there a type of judging that opens the door to defensiveness? To repentance?

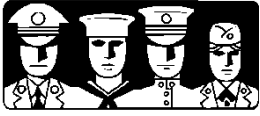
